Illicit fentanyl that mimics common medications like aspirin and Xanax are in our communities!

Fentanyl is Dangerous & Deadly Illicit fentanyl is dangerous and 100+ times more powerful than morphine. The pills being found in the community have no visible indication as to their contents. It is important to remember that even a small dose of fentanyl can cause the user to overdose or die and such incidents have increased in Arizona in recent months.

As a community we can help stop this drug epidemic from claiming the lives of those we love by talking about the dangers of drug use.

This is Not Prescription Fentanyl | Illicitly-produced fentanyl has been found added to heroin, meth, and cocaine to increase their potency. Some people believe they are purchasing another drug, like Xanax, and don't know that it's fentanyl – which often results in overdose deaths.

You Can Help Naloxone (brand name, Narcan®) is an opioid antagonist that can reverse an opioid overdose. Naloxone is available without a prescription at local pharmacies or free through local health departments and

With illicit fentanyl pills available in our community, it is very important to remember that ANY pill, if not obtained personally and in its original packaging, MAY be counterfeit and contain fentanyl.

In cases of a drug overdose, immediately call 9-1-1. A Good Samaritan law was passed in Arizona, when you call to report a drug overdose, you have legal protections.
